A very Happy New Year (and Decade) to all our Members, and we hope that you have all survived the arctic weather. All those soppy songs about 'white Christmasses' are a bad joke compared to the reality for a large part of the UK. So we must all look forward to Spring and our programmes for your enjoyment.

Firstly a word of warning - Parking on the Streatham Campus

Many of you will be aware that the Streatham Campus is undergoing major new building projects. What you are not perhaps aware of is how very disruptive these are proving to be: the Campus is one huge building site, which changes from day to day. Crucially, most of the old familiar parking places are gone, even in the evenings, notably Queen's Car Park, the Stocker Road Car Parks, the Streatham Court/Xfi Car Park and the Great Hall Car Park (regularly used by the majority of patrons visiting the Northcott Theatre). The main car parks are now right at the top of the hill, near the playing fields, behind the Innovation Centre, known as Car Parks A and B. The slog down to the main campus buildings is only slightly mitigated by an occasional minibus shuttle service, which stops in the evening. For those Members who would like to park somewhat closer to the centre of things, there are small car parks at the back of the Old Library, in front of the Hatherly Building, and along Perry Road in front of the Washington Singer Building, also along the Queen's Drive as far as Queen's Building. There is no guarantee that these spaces will not be invaded by bulldozers and men in yellow jackets, but so far they are largely untouched. We hope nevertheless that Members coming to enjoy some of our events will not be put off too much by these hazards.

Annual General Meeting

The AGM was held on Friday 16 October; there were 58 Members present. There were some elections, resulting in changes in the composition of the Committee as follows: Bruce Coleman will be our new President for 2009/10, in place of Mary Ravenhill. Keith Blanchard, our Treasurer, is replaced by Wojtek Krzanowski, and Peter Corbin and Anne Mayes (Ordinary Members of the Committee) are replaced by Roger Coles and Alastair Logan. Laurie Burbridge has been unanimously elected as President Elect for 2009/10. The subscription is held for another year at £6 for a single or joint membership. The Chairman, in his Report, was pleased to reveal that his worries about finding Members to take over the running of some Groups were laid to rest by the appearance of several Leaders: Helen Pope and Alastair Logan will take over the Music/Opera Group, Frankie Peroni and Liz Smith will take over the Restaurant Group, and Laurie Burbridge has agreed to restart the very successful Wine Tasting Group he had to close down for a couple of years. UERSA has been developing useful links with other service departments in the University, notably the Development and Alumni Relations Department, whose monthly listing of events at the University will be sent to Members, complementing the University News in Brief already circulated.

Personal Notes

Roderick Ross: We are sure that nearly everybody will have heard the sad news that Roderick Ross, University Registrar (until 1954), and Secretary thereafter until his retirement in 1975, died on Christmas Eve 2009; his funeral was on 15th January. His long service through the reigns of four Principals/Vice-Chancellors was much valued, as was his leading

role in setting up the University's twinning association with Rennes University. He was a loyal Member of UERSA, and a good friend to many of our Members.

We have also to report with much sadness the deaths of **Tom Oakes**, and **Dr John Cousins**, retired member of the Department of Physics.

Reports on General Events

Apart from the AGM in October, UERSA Members have taken part in two events recently:

<u>Coach Trip to Salisbury</u>: on 17th November 22 Members went on a coach trip to the cathedral city of Salisbury, in fine autumn weather. Most of them took a tour of the famous Cathedral, with two intrepid Members going up the tower, which proved to be a wonderful experience.

<u>Christmas Lunch</u>: this annual feast was held on 17th December, in the Devon Hotel at Matford, Exeter, and was as usual a great success, with 72 people there enjoying an excellent venue, great food and good company.

Reports on Group Events

<u>Music Group</u>: there were two events in the autumn: Bach's B-minor Mass in the Cathedral on 19th November, with the Exeter Festival Chorus, a magnificent performance much enjoyed; and Janacek's opera *Jenufa*, in an absolutely stunning performance by the Glyndbourne Touring Opera group. In spite of its dark, not to say horrifying, story, it was a most moving and beautifully sung and staged experience.

<u>Gardens Group</u>: the last visit in the season was to Burnham Orchid Nurseries on 24th September.

The Garden Group has now gone into hibernation until the Spring.

Restaurant Group: the Group paid two visits in the autumn, to the Bell Inn at Thorverton, where we were treated to a delicious meal in this gastro-pub; and to Lily's, one of several eateries recently sprung up in Fore Street, Exeter. The meal was pleasant, but the arrangements were a little disorganised so some of us didn't get quite what we thought we had ordered, and there was a feeling that 25 of us put a bit of a strain on the restaurant facilities, which are really geared to smaller parties.

Bridge Group: having been ousted from Queen's, this enterprising small Group decided to move to Knightley, by kind permission of the Director of Music. Here the first meeting in their new home took place on 28th October, accompanied by the sweet tones of a singing rehearsal downstairs. Group Members are determined to stay in their warm and comfortable billet as long as they are welcome, and have bought a couple of proper card tables to celebrate.

<u>Walking Group</u>: after a mad summer a more peaceful autumn, with visits to Coldridge along quiet paths and lanes in deepest Devon beyond Crediton; to Manaton, round the landmarks of Bowerman's nose, Hound Tor and Haytor Medieval Village; to Eggesford, using the Tarka Train to get to the beautiful rural walks; to Exmouth, for a fascinating walk round "unknown" Exmouth; to Bickleigh Mill for an enjoyable mud-slog; to the Grand Western Canal at Tiverton for a leisurely walk, and a slightly less good experience with lunch in a "tea shoppe" in Tiverton which had a problem with staffing, leading to long delays; finally to Escot for the traditional Christmas walk round the estate with a slap-up lunch at the Coach House. Apart from a rather grey and chilly Escot, the autumn sun shone brightly on all the walkers – they bear a charmed life.
