Personal Notes

Sadly, we have a longer list of deaths to report than we have had for some time. Some of the people will have been well known to many members, several only to a few.

Thomas J Barling, died on 22nd September 2011 at the age of 99. He was Senior Lecturer in Education (French) 1949-77, at the University's Department of Education at Thornlea, before the merger with St Luke's. Dr John Alderson CBE QPM, Chief Constable of Devon and Cornwall 1973-82, died on 7th October aged 89. Dr Alderson was awarded an Hon LLD by the University of Exeter in 1979 and after his retirement advised Bill Tupman in his work at the Centre for Police and Criminal Justice Studies.

Professor Wilfred Fishwick, peacefully, aged 93 at Spiers House, New Malden, on Friday 14th October 2011

Lady Vera Cook, widow of former Vice-Chancellor Sir James Cook, died on 7th November 2011 at Exmouth.

Peter Corbin, B.A., PhD., died on 21st November 2011 in Exeter. He was a member of the School of English Studies, University of Exeter for 34 years and was a Leader of our Restaurant Group for several years.

Sandy Simpson died Dec 3rd 2011 after a long illness. She was our Membership Secretary for three years until 2007, during which "her helpfulness and efficiency were much appreciated". (UERSA newsletter 10)

Mike Wendon, former Assistant Director of Finance, died December 13th 2011. **Dr Richard Orme**, died Jan 7th 2012. He was a consultant paediatrician at the RD&E but also held a joint appointment as a Lecturer in the University.
