Local interest events:

Restoring **The Stover Canal** in South Devon, to the west of Kingsteignton is taking place. It runs for nearly 2 miles from north of Teigngrace to the outskirts of Newton Abbot and originally included 5 locks. The exit from the canal was through Jetty Marsh Lock at Newton Abbot on to the tidal Whitelake channel, and from there to the River Teign and the docks at Teignmouth.

The Stover Canal Society has merged with Stover Canal Trust which works with local councils and other interested parties to preserve the line of the canal and to restore it as an amenity for the local community. Some lengths of the canal towpath form part of the Templer Way, an historic trail which links the canal, the tramway and other legacies of the Templer family.

The opening of the Stover Way cycle and walkway from Ventiford Basin to Teignbridge Crossing gives greater public access to the canal features and is worth a visit to see the progress so far.

Walking Group Longdown – St Thomas

On a beautiful autumn day a number of the walking group members met at West Exe School to exchange vehicles and journey to Longdown for a guided linear walk to St Thomas, Exeter via Ide. We covered approx 5 miles and took in part of the old Teign Valley Railway track. David Kernick and Vicky were kind enough to provide a tea/coffee break and a well earned scrumptious lunch. Many thanks for their generosity and kindness. The Lazy Toad is an attractive Grade II listed Devon Inn. Dating back to the late 18th Century, with possibly an earlier core, it features oak beamed ceilings and slate floors, good locally grown or sourced food - some from their smallholding - local real ales, local ciders and wines, a cobbled courtyard - where once the farrier and wheelwright plied his trade - and beautiful walled beer garden. Prior to 2007 the Inn was known as the Agricultural Inn. It is situated just off the Exe Valley Way and the Devonshire Heartland Way, a few hundred yards from many glorious walks along the banks of the River Exe with its' kingfishers, swifts, swallows, sand martins, swans, geese, ducks, cormorants and much more wildlife.


Restaurant Group UERSA Christmas Lunch - Devon Hotel
