## **UNIVERSITY OF EXETER IN THE NEWS**

Twin brothers Adam and Jack Tremlett have defied the odds by becoming doctors on the same day. The pair, from lybridge, both graduated in Medicine at the **University of Exeter** in July. Adam is going to Derriford Hospital in Plymouth and Jack will be at the Royal Devon and Exeter hospital. (DevonLive, 19 July)

Following a significant upturn in numbers putting Medicine down as their first choice, The **University of Exeter** offered medical applicants free accommodation for a year and £10,000 if they agree to defer their place. Students holding an offer to start their course in autumn 2021 were able to access the deal if they push their studies back a year and start in 2022 instead. (The Independent, July)

The **University of Exeter** is ranked 143<sup>rd</sup> in the world in the latest *Times Higher Education* World University Rankings, released on Thursday, September 2nd 2021 – a rise of 31 places. The University has also moved back into the top 20 in the UK in the league table, rising five places to 19<sup>th</sup>. (Times Higher, Sept)

Student accommodation at **Exeter** has been ranked as the second best throughout the entirety of the UK. Loughborough was voted the best. The research carried out by Uni Compare, shows the best universities for accommodation using reviews from current and past students. (DevonLive, 8 Sept)

The Cornwall housing crisis, made a lot worse by second homes, holiday rentals, and relocating has hit students hard as they struggle to find suitable housing. Students at both Falmouth University and the **Exeter Penryn Campus** have reported being unable to find a rented house to live in for their studies. (CornwallLive, 10 Sept)

## Using Links to Zoom Meetings and Recordings

We have found that on some devices and systems it is not possible to just click on the link provided to join Zoom meetings and on these you may have to use one of the following methods.

- 1. Copy and paste the link into your browser.
- 2. If you are using Windows mail you may find that the link is shown in grey rather than blue and when you click on the link it displays a message saying it cannot open the link. If this happens you can try the following:

  (a) Launch the Zoom app. Click on the home icon and click on JOIN. Enter the meeting ID.

  OR (b) Make Microsoft Edge your default browser. Restart your device.

This should have fixed the problem and if you don't like Edge as your default browser you can change the default back to the one you want and restart the device.
