## Annual General Meeting

The University of Exeter Retired Staff Association Annual General Meeting will take place on October 5<sup>th</sup> 2006 at 6 p.m. in the Xfi Building, Streatham Court. The Agenda is included with this Newsletter and, as you will see from the note at the top of the Agenda, those attending will be rewarded with a glass of wine. Subscriptions can also be paid at the AGM, directly to Sandy Simpson, the Membership Secretary, a nifty way to avoid paying postage on your subscription renewal.

For those hesitating about coming to the AGM we would like to point out that the Xfi Building is one of Exeter University's more interesting new buildings – definitely worth a visit.

## <u>Membership</u>

Our membership has increased from 299 in April to 315 in August. Our Chairman, Laurie Burbridge and Secretary Jan Reynolds went to the University's "Planning for Retirement" event in June, and generated a lot of interest and hopefully attracted a lot of new members.

## **General Notes**

Subscriptions: The UERSA Executive Committee has recently considered the level of our annual subscription. After much discussion, we will be recommending to the Annual General Meeting that for 2006/2007 the subscription should remain at the present level of £6. The key issue here is the wide disparity in our costs, both in money and in people's time, between sending information either by post or by email. Sending out information by e-mail incurs a negligible cost. Conversely, the cost of photocopying, envelopes, and postage is a very significant proportion of UERSA's annual expenditure. Some 60% of our members currently elect to receive information by post; this includes a significant number of people who have an e-mail address but who choose not to use it. Whilst we appreciate that there will for the foreseeable future be some of our members for whom the use of a computer is not acceptable or even possible, we do need to encourage everyone to use e-mail whenever they can. One possibility considered was to raise the subscription to  $\pounds 8$ and then offer a 50% discount for those prepared to rely on e-mail. However, the Committee decided that this would be discriminatory and divisive. So we agreed to use friendly persuasion and to make a plea that, if at all possible, you would elect to receive information by e-mail – every little helps! Meanwhile we would reiterate that the subscription stays at £6 for single or joint membership for 2006-7.

<u>Coffee mornings</u>: Although positive response to the suggestion made in the previous Newsletter was small, we feel that the matter is worth pursuing and two Committee Members (Jan and Sandy) will be investigating other possible venues for a regular get-together; we feel that once something is started the "snowball" effect may well cut in.

Also, a health and wellness fair on Thursday  $26^{\text{th}}$  October from 12 p.m. - 4 p.m. in the Lower Exam Hall in the Great Hall. Anyone is welcome to pop in and have a look around. They are still organising who will be there but it will include the British Heart Foundation and the Primary Care Trust who will have stands on smoking cessation, cancer prevention, healthy eating, diabetes awareness. There will also be physiotherapy and reflexology stands. They are planning to get someone in to carry out blood pressure, blood sugar and cholesterol testing so it would be a good opportunity for people to have a brief health check and pick up information on where to get help and sample some free treatments.

There will be a Weight Management Session every Thursday, 10-11.30 a.m. which will be a weigh-in session followed by a chat on nutrition, motivation, etc., then a 45 minute low impact fitness class. It is being held in the studio at Streatham Sports Centre and will be £5 a session (the first session is free with a flyer which can be obtained from the Streatham Sports Centre)

After a tour of the Safari Park and the House, several more adventurous members explored the other attractions: the Gardens, Safari Boats, Butterfly Garden, Railway, and Maze.

<u>Reed Hall Garden Party</u>: for the second year we held our Garden Party in June in the grounds of Reed Hall, in fine weather as before. This was a joint event with the Exeter Branch of the Historical Association, where our Treasurer Bruce Coleman, wearing his history hat, gave an interesting talk and tour of Reed Hall to the members of both associations.

<u>Tremough Campus, Cornwall</u>: 19 members set off from Exeter by coach and were joined by three other members from Cornwall. Members were given a tour of the grounds and buildings, and were able to see some of the work of the students. A most informative and interesting day- many thanks to Tremough for making us so welcome.

<u>Holland Hall Afternoon Tea Party</u>: This extremely imposing building commands impressive views of the Exe Valley. After a Bucks Fizz reception in the Upper Bar, Members were taken in groups by the manager Nancy Smith to see the very superior facilities enjoyed by the modern student (and of course by the conference delegates of the many conferences who are now queueing up to use Holland Hall). It might be worth mentioning that Holland Hall is planning to open its restaurant this autumn at lunchtime to all members of the University. This would provide a very pleasant alternative to Reed Hall – and the views are spectacular. Check with Holland Hall before paying a first visit as we do not know the exact timing of the opening.
