Crediton Circular

The Somerset space walk - 8 miles from the Sun to Pluto – depicts the relative positions of the planets and their size on the same scale.

The 8 miles represents the 3.7 billion miles to Pluto so that 12 inches represents 87,000 miles. Saturn is about 10 inches in diameter whilst the Sun's diameter is about 10 ft. The distance of 93,000 miles from the Sun to Earth is represented by a walk of 350 yds.
